# **Rear Commodore**

Spring is almost here, and we are starting to get back on the water more frequently. As the weather improves and Commissioning approaches, we have a few things to work on.

Keelboat Docks - Thank you to the exceedingly vast majority of you that follow the rules and make things easy on the Rear Commodore and the dockmaster. There are a few that are making things difficult for all of us. I'm going to highlight a few of the rules that we've had trouble with.

- Please don't put your boat in a slip without approval 1. from me or the dockmaster.
- 2. The wait list is authoritative for slip assignments. We have a few boats moving out, and we plan on working through the wait list in strict order.
- If you sell a boat that is in a slip, that boat doesn't neces-3. sarily get to stay in that slip if there is a wait list. The member has a spot on the list, not the boat. You retain the slip for whatever boat you get to replace the one you sold. If you give up the slip, the next person on the wait list gets the slip, not the purchaser of the boat.
- If you have a slip and want to upgrade, we will follow 4.

the same process that we use for campsites, which is based on SNAP number.

5. All boats in a slip must be insured and in sailable condition

Alternate Work Day - For those of you that couldn't make it to the last Work Day, the alternate Work Day is March 23rd. We've got a few things to take care of before Commissioning, and I'll be leading a couple of work details. Remember, that is one week before Commissioning so come help make the club shine for our opening day. Please contact me if you can make it to the alternate Work Day.

Electronic Race Start Systems - We'll be installing electronic starting systems that will run the standard 5-minute countdown and are also capable of a 3-minute start for the juniors. These are extremely easy to operate and will be wired into the electrical systems of Race 1 and Signal 1 and will use the existing electric horns on the boats. These will greatly reduce the workload of the race committees and make things easier for everyone.

Race Committee Boats - Advance Marine is working through the fleet, and barring any surprises all of the boats will have been serviced by the time you read this. So far the boats were all in good shape, and we should all be commended for taking good care of them last year. Good job, everyone.

Finally, if you see Tom Payne, give him a pat on the back for the fiberglass work he is doing on Race 5. One of the corners of the boat was mostly missing and Tom has been rebuilding it so that we can reinstall the rub rail. Thanks, Tom!

**THREE:** Per the LNYC By-Laws, Article V, #6, "The Club is not responsible for boats, personal property or the personal liability of members or guests. Specifically, the Club is not responsible for the personal liability of any member or guest; as well as any loss, theft, or damage of any personal items stored or used at the Club. This includes but is not limited to boats, motors, sails, trailers, campers, tents, clothing, etc. It is the individual responsibility of each member to carry insurance against such losses." The Safety Committee encourages all members to review their exposure to loss and have the appropriate insurance coverage.


